The CWO Prayer

Moved by a compulsion of the Holy Spirit, we cannot remain ignorant of this injustice in our midst.

We long for all humanity to be acknowledged as equal,

particularly among your community of the church,

so we pray grieving for the lost gifts of so many women.

We ask you, God of all peoples, to bring insight and humility to all those in positions of dominance, and an understanding that the ascended Lord called us all to act

doing Christ's work here and now. We ask this of you, God our Creator, Jesus our Redeemer, Spirit our Sustainer

Are we afraid? A few thoughts...

Over the last week I have been struck by the link between the words: fear, petrification and the Church.

Thinking of Christ's words "You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my Church" we are given the link between Peter: Petrus, (the Latin word for stone) and the strength of the foundation that the Church will need to stand, develop and withstand attack. In this sense it is positive. However we also use petrified (being made into stone) as meaning we are scared rigid...

Are we afraid? Is the Church afraid? Certainly people are afraid to speak about women's ordination. We are "forbidden" to discuss women's ordination and most lay people, priests and Bishops do not do so in public. Priests are demoralised and afraid someone in their congregation will report them to their Bishop or Rome – and some do.

We are not encouraged to discuss change. Bishops are not apparently promoting the collegiality that Vatican II envisioned. They rarely consult us, and if they are representing our views to Rome we don't know about it and are not part of a dialogue. The structures of the Church are, I think, becoming literally and metaphorically petrified: rigid, frightened and set in stone. The hierarchy is mostly, not obviously dynamic or responsive to the people of God. Stony places and hierarchical and "fortification thinking" can inhibit growth and life.

In CWO many of us are called to speak out and our words may fall on stone, but, speaking for myself (and maybe all of us?) I hope that I can continue to push against the fear and petrification in me and around me. We are told "Do not be afraid..."

There isn't the natural and the supernatural after Christ. There is one world, and it is the supernatural. That is what the tearing of the Temple veil "from top to bottom" at the death of Jesus surely means (Matthew 27:51).

The body and life of Jesus has told the world we may no longer separate the Temple and the world. There is nothing profane (*pro fanum* = beyond the temple) once we are given eyes to see. All is sacred.
